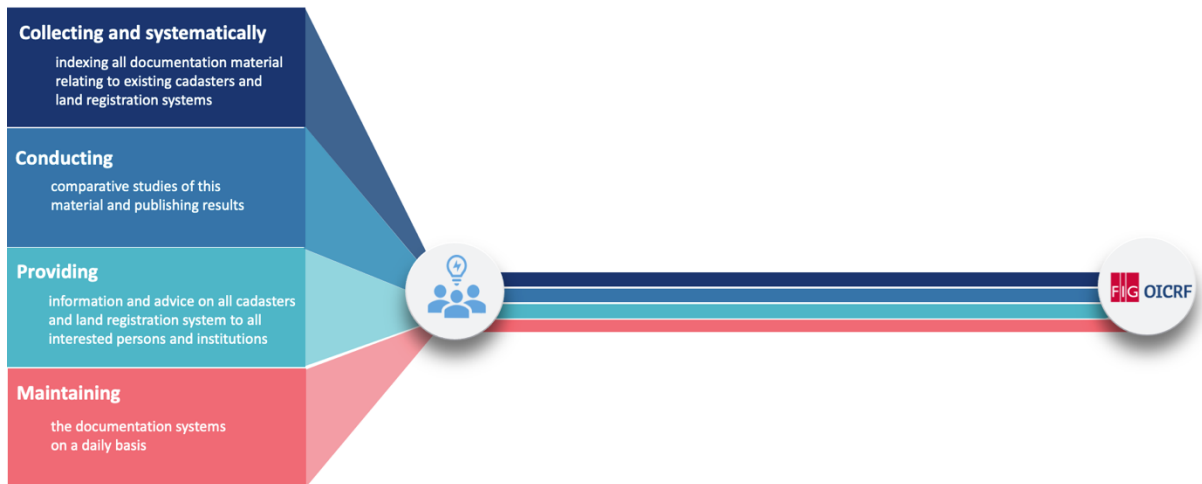


OICRF Annual Report 2024

OICRF - the International Office for Cadastre and Land Records - is one of the permanent bodies of the International Federation of Surveyors (FIG). OICRF serves as a documentation and study centre for land administration and is charged with the following tasks:

OICRF in 2024 – the Database

As of May 31, 2024, the OICRF digital Land Administration Library houses 21,414 publications, encompassing a diverse array of resources such as conference documents, magazine articles, and reports related to land administration. The contents of the library are accessible in multiple languages, with the collection comprising 284 publications in Dutch, 694 in French, 569 in German, 64 in Italian, 40 in Russian, 296 in Spanish, and 17,106 in English.

OICRF is actively engaged in a significant quality enhancement initiative. This improvement focuses on several key areas: standardizing country names according to ISO standards, resolving missing links and years in the database (where some of the most valuable resources are found), eliminating duplicate entries, and implementing standardized tags and keywords. This intensive process is being diligently managed by **Stephan Honer**, whose efforts are crucial to its success.

Currently, we have paused active promotion of OICRF. This strategic decision allows us to concentrate on these quality improvements. In the future we plan to actively promote OICRF within the FIG community again.

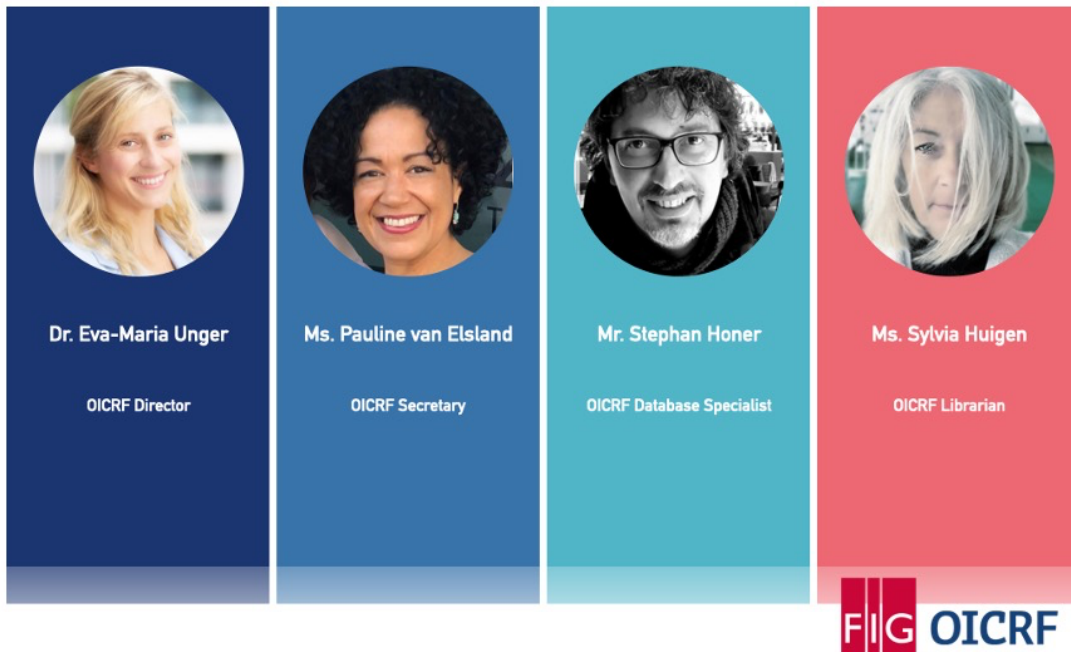

OICRF is historically prioritizing collaboration with Commission 7 and its associated working groups, this year we are placing a special emphasis on uploading documents related to the UN-GGIM Framework for Effective Land Administration (FELA), the Land Administration Domain Model (LADM), and the Fit-For-Purpose Land Administration approach (FFPLA). Plans are underway to enhance cooperation with other FIG Commissions and Task Forces in the future. Additionally, there is a dedicated effort to include documents from recent events hosted by prominent organizations such as the World Bank, and UN-Habitat GLTN, and others.
